IMPORTANT DATES TO REMEMBER

SEPTEMBER 1: Office of Undergraduate Admissions begins notification of admission status on a rolling basis.

OCTOBER 1: University begins awarding Webster Academic Scholarships. To apply, simply check the appropriate box on the Application for Undergraduate Admission. Note: The Daniel Webster Full-Tuition Scholarship for freshmen, and the Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship for transfers, require a separate application, available from the Office of Undergraduate Admissions.

JANUARY 1: Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) available. The FAFSA is available at your high school guidance office or college financial aid office, and online at fafsa.ed.gov. Webster's code is 002521.

JANUARY 1: Housing application forms available on-line at www.webster.edu.

MARCH 1: Date for FAFSA submission to maximize consideration for financial aid and scholarships.

APRIL 20: Registration for transfer students begin.

MAY 1: Tuition deposits become nonrefundable after this date.

MAY 15: Registration for Fall freshman classes begins.
