Webster University invites registered nurses to earn a Bachelor of Science degree in Nursing by attending evening courses at our St. Louis or Kansas City campus or by studying online.

The B.S.N. Curriculum

Webster requires 128 credit hours for a baccalaureate degree. To help you achieve that goal, the University offers transfer credit for students who have an associate degree in nursing or who have completed prior nursing coursework.

Students seeking a B.S.N. degree are required to meet four of Webster University's nine general educational goals and to take at least 30 credit hours at Webster University.

Prerequisite Courses

...include English, psychology, sociology, microbiology, anatomy and physiology, and a computer course (or validated computer competency). You will plan your academic program with a faculty member before beginning your B.S.N. studies.

Transfer Credit

DIPLOMA GRADUATES

You will receive 32 college credit hours for prior nursing coursework after successful completion of NURS 3010 *Concepts of Professional Nursing* and NURS 3020 *Health Assessment*, and demonstration of appropriate nursing knowledge. Other college credit hours are granted as transfer credits.

ASSOCIATE DEGREE GRADUATES

If you have successfully completed an associate degree in nursing, all of your previous college coursework will be considered for transfer toward the B.S.N.

- Current licensure (or eligibility for licensure) as a registered nurse in the State of Missouri or Florida
- Completion of a Webster University application for admission
- Pre-admission academic planning with a B.S.N. faculty member
- Transcripts from a nursing school and all collegiate institutions from which academic credit has been granted
- Grade-point average (G.P.A.) of 2.5 in previous scholastic work

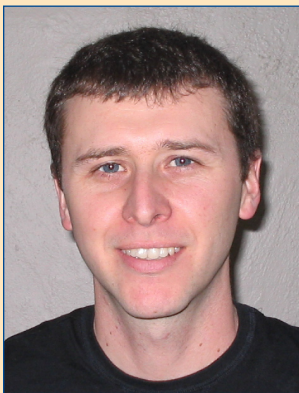
