### Traditional class

Friday, April 11 2003 (5 to 9 p.m.) - Saturday, April 12, 2003 (8 a.m. to 4 p.m.)

**Course Description:** This course is for individuals who have the desire to locate grants that are offered to educators, trainers, and instructors. It covers searching for grants using the Internet and the traditional methods of locating grant opportunities locally. The course also covers searching for correct writing techniques and proper terminology. The course will offer various tips and suggestions for effective grant writing to help simplify the process and help ensure success.

### Learning Outcomes:

- Students will learn how and where to search for a clear understanding of basic principles and terminology associated with grants and grant writing.
- Students will develop an understanding of the various types of grants available.
- Students will become familiar with how to search for local grant opportunities and how to search for grants offered via the Internet.
- Students will become knowledgeable about common mistakes made in writing grants and what to do and what not to do when writing grants.
- Students will be able to demonstrate the knowledge gained in all aspects of grant searching and in basic grant writing by creating a final project.
