1. **Course Description:** This course reviews the strategies used for effective technology planning and management. Determining level of technology integration, evaluating appropriate technology acquisitions, developing successful technology plans, and planning successful technology staff development will be reviewed through readings and student projects. State and national standards for student and teacher performance will be a focus for the course.

2. **Learning Outcomes:**
 - (Students will demonstrate knowledge of important strategies and research related to planning and management of instructional projects and programs. (1.2.11.2; 1.2.11.4)
 - Students will demonstrate knowledge of important state and national initiatives, issues, and the changing role of technology in education. (1.2.11.3; 1.2.11.6)
 - Students will demonstrate competency in developing a staff development plan based on determined staff skills and level of integration. (1.2.11.2; 1.2.11.3; 1.2.11.4)

3. **Course Requirements:** This online course includes a schedule of required readings, class preparations and assignments, discussions, and student projects. Students will be expected to read all assigned readings and to participate in weekly topic discussions. Students must also be willing to have some of their work posted on the web for viewing by other students. Students must have Internet access (from home, office, or on-campus) and the ability to use Internet tools and other software.
