Course Description: Students examine communication and information technology in professional nursing. The role of evidence as it informs contemporary nursing practice is explored. Included are concepts and skills for oral and written communication, informatics, and information literacy. *Prerequisites: Admission the BSN program; computer course or validated computer competency.*

1. Determine the nature and extent of information needed.
2. Use a variety of search strategies to access information.
3. Evaluate the quality of retrieved information.
4. Demonstrate oral communication skills.
5. Apply APA format in writing a formal paper
6. Discuss academic honesty in as it applies to written and oral communication.
7. Discuss the specialty practice of nursing informatics.

1. Academic Honesty Assignment—2 part AssignmentPart One- Database Search & Academic Honesty Reference List.

Use Academic Search Premier Database to search for articles on Academic Honesty

- What other terms do you see that are related? Try adding some of these terms and see the effect this has on the article results. Note these differences for a discussion.
- Save one full text article
- Use Article Linker to retrieve and save one article that is full text in another database.
- Use the Document Request Form to request an article that is not full text online but the Periodical is in the Webster Library. Save that article.
- Use the Document Request Form to request an article from a journal not held by Webster through interlibrary loan. Save this article.

Submit four articles Week One

Type and submit Week Two a Title page and Reference list of the the four articles you located when searching for articles about Academic Honesty.

Part Two- Academic Honesty Paper

Choose one the four articles you located your database search for articles on academic honesty. Write a summary of this one article on academic honesty/ plagiarism (in your own words, that meets the criteria for not plagiarizing). End the paper with a Discussion the application of academic honesty/plagiarism to both written and oral communication in academic and professional settings. Submit your summary and discussion—Title page, Body of the paper and Reference(s) Week Four.

2. Informatics Written assignment—3 part assignmentPart One- Informatics Assignment References

Search the databases for scholarly nursing articles on one aspect of nursing informatics (must be current-within the last 5 years). Possible topics include: EMR, a hospital information system (Chartware, NIS, Praxis), informatics and nursing education, or informatics competencies. Submit APA style Title page and Reference list and copies of articles Week Three

Part Two-Paper First Draft

Read the articles and write a paper in APA format using Word to include:

Title Page

Body of the paper (4-6 pages)

Introduction

Integrated Review of the Literature

Summary/Conclusion

References (A minimum of five articles must be used)

Submit draft to the Instructor, Online Writing Center: and Turnitin Week Five.

Request and give permission for Writing Center feedback to be sent to instructor.

Part Three-Final Paper

Use feedback received from Instructor, Writing Center, and Turnitin to revise paper and resubmit final paper Week Eight.

3. Website Search and Evaluation Paper

Find two (2) health-related websites directed toward the general public and using the distributed rubric criteria, evaluate each site based on the information available on the site. Write a two (2) part APA style paper in which for each website you:

- Identify the search engine used, the specific topic searched, and why.
- Answer the questions about each criteria: Accuracy, Authority, Objectivity, Currency, and Coverage, using complete sentences.
- Based on the information obtained using the criteria, answer and justify your response to the question "Would you recommend this site to others?"

Submit your Title page, Paper Body with parts about each site addressing the three bulleted points above, and References page Week Six

4. Oral Presentation/PowerPoint

In this assignment you will be expected to demonstrate effective oral communication skills as well as the design and presentation of an effective PowerPoint. The topic for the presentations is your work or workplace. Share with your audience information about yourself, your workplace, and your role/responsibilities. You also might include your co-workers, parts of your job that you particularly enjoy, challenges you face, opportunities, etc.

Oral Presentation - Power point

Utilize effective oral communication skills in a presentation to your classmates and instructor. The presentation should be 10-15 minutes using 10-15 slides designed as a PowerPoint for an oral presentation before a group. The slides should contain your oral presentation in the slide notes. Save the file as a

PowerPoint Presentation with the file name as your last name followed by "OralP2". (e.g. Thompson_OralP2) Upload the PowerPoint in the assignments area Week Seven. Grading rubrics will be distributed and utilized for both Oral Presentation and PowerPoints.

5. Active Participation in classroom discussions and activities. Participation in WorldClassRoom discussions, when indicated, to include original responses to each posed question and a second post containing a comment directed to another student's response.
