NOTE: At least 50% of core courses in the major must be taken at Webster, i.e., students transferring to the BA/MNGT must take at least 18 credits of MNGT/ECON/ACCT at Webster.

Required for graduation:

- 128 credits, 2.0 (out of 4.0) GPA at Webster, 30 of last 36 credits in residency.
- For BA/MNGT, 27 credits in general education covering nine fields: Critical Thinking, Communications, Historical Consciousness, Humanities, Cultural Understanding, Values, Arts, Scientific Understanding, and Mathematics. Nursing requires four of the nine general education areas in the BSN degree.

Guidelines for General Education courses as electives from JCCC (C- or better required):

CRI=Critical Thinking (3 cr)

Courses meeting the Critical Thinking requirement include JCCC courses PHIL 121 Intro to Philosophy, PHIL 124 Logic and Critical Thinking, PHIL 161 Elementary Symbolic Logic, MATH 241 Calculus, or SOC 125 Social Problems.

COM=Communications (3 cr)

Courses meeting Communications include ENGL 121, 122, other ENGL writing classes, BUS 150 Business Communications, SPD 121, Public Speaking.

HST=Historical Consciousness (3 cr)

Courses meeting HST include any course in American history, African-American history, Western Civilization, ancient history, history of art, music, film, musical theatre, broadcasting, photography, etc.

HUM=Humanities (3 cr)

Courses meeting Humanities at JCCC include those which introduce students to the great ideas and thinkers of history, e.g., literature, mythology, philosophy, political theory, religion, theatre or art appreciation courses.

VAL=Values (3 cr)

Courses meeting Values include SOC 122 Intro to Sociology, ANTH 125 Cultural Anthropology, PHIL 143 Ethics, or any Ethics in... courses, political science courses, and developmental (child, adolescent) psychology courses.

CUL=Cultural Understanding (3 cr)

Courses meeting Cultural Understanding include any foreign language course, most courses listed in JCCC's catalog as meeting the "Cultural Diversity" requirement, courses dealing with non-western cultures and civilization.

ARTS=Arts Appreciation (3 cr)

Courses meeting Arts Appreciation include music, art, dance, theatre, film, creative writing (poetry, fiction, drama), including those courses in which the student engages in the art, i.e. creates art, takes music lessons, dances.

SCI=Scientific Understanding (3 cr)

Courses meeting Scientific Understanding include both lab sciences, such as biology, chemistry, botany, physics, geology, and non-lab science survey courses, including PSYC 130 Introduction to Psychology.

MTH=Mathematics (3 cr)

Courses meeting Mathematics include MATH 120 Business Mathematics or MATH 171 College Algebra, and MATH 181 Statistics, or courses for which these are prerequisites.
