Dean's Award Recipients Named for Spring I

Three students have been selected to receive the Dean's Award for Service for Spring I. The award recipients are Ruth Bohlin, Linda Golden, and Matthew Ullrich.

Ruth Bohlin, a junior advertising major from El Paso, Texas was nominated by Sandy Tomey, coordinator in Student Affairs. She was nominated for leading a small group of students to travel to Pass Christian, Mississippi over Fall Break to work on hurricane relief efforts, specifically gutting damaged houses so that they could be repaired. Linda Golden, a senior photography media major from Houston, Texas was nominated by Jennifer Violet, reservations coordinator for the University Center. She was nominated for coordinating a service trip to

Outstanding Student Employee Award Recipient Named for Spring I

New Business

Student Grant Fund

\$630 was granted to Journal members to attend the Missouri College Media Association convention in St. Louis.

Ballot Language

Proposal for Proposition A to be on the upcoming spring ballot. The motion to pass this proposition was granted. Proposition A states: Should an activity fee of \$30 per semester be enacted to increase the quality and quantity of campus-sponsored events and programs? Funds from this fee will go directly to Campus Activities and to the Multicultural Center and International Student Affairs (MCISA). This fee will apply to full-time, flat-fee undergraduate students (13 credits or more per semester) studying at Webster's home campus.

Allocation Fund:

A motion of \$500 has been passed to take care of three plaques for the memorial of students. \$2,764.43 is currently in the Allocation fund. \$2,000 is coming back from the kiosk and fees from student grant fund will be reimbursed.
