Election Campaign Regulations

- In addition to having a complete application, including an electronic photo, all candidates must be confirmed to have a 2.0 GPA and be in good standing with the University (per the SGA Constitution).
- Once a candidate receives confirmation from the Elections Commissioner, campaigning may begin.
- All campaign efforts must be in accordance with the university policy on Posting Notices and Solicitation, found in the Student Handbook. This information is also available at: <http://www.webster.edu/studlife/StuA/handbook/solicita.htm>. Please read carefully regulations about flyers and chalking.
- During the elections (12:01am Monday through 11:59pm Thursday), advertising or campaigning is NOT ALLOWED within 10 feet of any public campus computer (since the elections are on-line, all computers are considered polling stations).
- No overly-aggressive campaigning, such as standing out on the quad, yelling, "Hey, you, vote for me!" Passive advertising is allowed, such as signs, flyers, etc. Passing out flyers to those who walk by is allowed - the key is that people are allowed to approach candidates, but candidates should not be approaching people who are otherwise engaged (studying, eating, etc.) and disturbing their privacy.
- Campaign violations will be handled on a case-by-case basis by the Elections Commissioner and the Director of the University Center and Student Activities. If considered serious enough, violations could be referred judicially through the Dean of Students office.
