

The Suzuki Workshop is an intensive two-day workshop for Suzuki violin and cello students involving small, medium, and large group classes, a guest recital, and a final group concert. In addition, all students will have the opportunity to learn from others through scheduled observation time.

Advanced violinists in Book 6 and up have special opportunities including an optional violin lesson with Ellen dePasquale (for which an additional fee is charged). Violinists in Book 5 and up must purchase and memorize "Souvenir de Sarasate" by William Potstock, in Volume 3 of Barbara Barber's book *Solos for Young Violinists*.

WORKSHOP FACULTY

Gabriel Bolkosky (Violin) teaches at the University of Michigan School of Music and is the Executive Director of The Phoenix Ensemble, a non-profit arts organization dedicated to helping artists and the educational community. He is also the first violinist of the Phoenix Quartet and performs extensively as a soloist and chamber musician.

Blake Brasch (Cello) teaches cello on the faculty of the Music Institute of Chicago. He is a registered teacher trainer of the Suzuki Association of the Americas and is the Administrative Director of the Chicago Suzuki Institute.

Kevin Buckley (Irish Fiddle) is a prize-winning traditional Irish fiddler who has toured with St. Louis Irish Arts and explored numerous musical genres including folk, blues, jazz, rock, and pop as both a composer and performer.

Ellen dePasquale (Violin Lessons) is the acting Associate Concertmaster of the Saint Louis Symphony and the former Associate Concertmaster of the Cleveland Symphony. She is a regular guest at leading music festivals in the United States and Europe and currently serves on the faculty of Temple University in Philadelphia.

Hays Hendricks (Violin) maintains a private violin studio in Cape Girardeau and is the Coordinator of the Suzuki Program at Southeast Missouri Music Academy. She has taught at institutes in Missouri, Minnesota, Kentucky, Illinois, and Singapore.

Sarah Montzka (Dalcroze Eurythmics) teaches on the faculty of the Music Institute of Chicago and serves on the Board of Directors of the Suzuki Association of the Americas. She is a popular clinician at workshops and institutes across the country, both as a Suzuki viola teacher and a Dalcroze Eurythmics specialist.
