Community Music School Announces David Commanday as New Conductor of the Young People's Symphonic Orchestra.

The Community Music School of Webster University (CMS) is pleased to announce **David Commanday** as the new conductor of the Young People's Symphonic Orchestra (YPSO). Commanday follows former YPSO conductor Richard Holmes who passed away in June 2011 after serving as the conductor from 1999-2011. Established over 25 years ago, the Young People's Symphonic Orchestra is the most advanced of the School's orchestras.

Patrick Jackson, conductor of the CMS Young People's Concert Orchestra and member of the search committee, expressed that he was impressed with Commanday's background and especially how he interacted with the orchestra during his audition. The conductor candidates were given several measures of music to prepare and work on with the ensemble, "during Commanday's audition he changed the sound of the entire orchestra and captured the essence of the music in just a few measures."

David Commanday is Artistic Director of the Heartland Festival Orchestra based in Washington, Illinois. He and the orchestra were named the Illinois Professional Orchestra and Conductor of the Year 2011 by the Illinois Council of Orchestras. Commanday has guest-conducted orchestras around the world, and his posts have included Music Director Boston Ballet, Associate Conductor New Jersey Symphony Orchestra, and Music Director, Peoria Symphony Orchestra. He is an accomplished cellist, and continues to perform and teach.

David Commanday has a great dedication to young musicians, having most recently served as Artistic Director of the New Jersey Youth Symphony. As Music Director of the Boston Youth Symphony Orchestras he was praised for its outstanding performances, world premieres, recordings, international tours, and 3 ASCAP awards.

Commanday has held faculty positions and conducted at Harvard University, Boston University, MIT, and Montclair State and Virginia Commonwealth Universities. He is active as a teaching and conducting clinician, conducting All-State and regional student orchestras as well as consulting internationally.

Founded in 1925, CMS offers outstanding music education and performance opportunities to students of all ages and abilities and serves the entire St. Louis metropolitan region. Classes are available in University City, at Faust Park in West County, and at CMS headquarters located on the Webster University campus in Webster Groves. For more information, call 314-968-5939.
