

The Suzuki Workshop is an intensive, two-day workshop for Suzuki violin and cello students involving small, medium, and large group classes, a guest recital, and a final group concert. In addition, all students will have the opportunity to learn from others through scheduled observation time.

Advanced violinists will have special opportunities, including an optional private lesson with Angie Smart for Book 6 and up violin students (for which an additional fee is charged). Violinists in Book 5 and up must purchase and memorize "Polish Dance" by Severn, in Volume 4 of Barbara Barber's book *Solos for Young Violinists*.

WORKSHOP FACULTY

Gabriel Bolkosky teaches at the University of Michigan School of Music and is the Executive Director of The Phoenix Ensemble, a non-profit arts organization dedicated to helping artists and the educational community. He is also the first violinist of the Phoenix Quartet and performs extensively as a soloist and chamber musician.

Donna Davis teaches Suzuki cello and Komodo Music (a young years Suzuki music program) at the Suzuki Institute of Dallas. She conducts the Cross Timbers Youth Orchestra and is active as a freelance and chamber musician.

Siri Geenen received her Bachelor of Music in violin performance from Northwestern University and her Master of Music in violin performance and Suzuki pedagogy from the University of Colorado. She has been teaching Suzuki for the past 16 years and has a violin studio in Columbia, MO.

Roxane McWilliams is the Resident Teaching Artist at Metro Theater Company. In addition to appearing onstage in many Metro Theater Company productions, she also teaches drama, creative movement, and improvisation to students in schools and community settings all over the St. Louis metro area.

Liesl Schoenberger, an alumna of our Suzuki Program, is currently teaching violin at Southeast Missouri State University and is pursuing a Doctorate at Yale University. She is a highly accomplished classical violinist who is also a prize-winning bluegrass/old-time fiddler.

Angie Smart is a first violinist with the Saint Louis Symphony Orchestra. Originally from the United Kingdom, she is a Suzuki parent, studio teacher, and frequent soloist and chamber musician.
