The following courses will be offered through the In-service Education Program at Webster University this summer. While these courses might be considered for State of Missouri or other tuition reimbursement programs, they are not designed for teacher licensure or certification. Students currently pursuing a Graduate-level School of Education degree at Webster University may transfer up to 6 hours of 5410 courses toward their degree with approval of their advisor. 5210 courses are offered for graduate credit which is applicable to district salary increment schedules and professional development. Some 5210 courses may be applicable toward a degree with prior approval of the advisor and the area of concentration coordinator.

LOCATION: Most classes meet at the Webster University campus, 470 E. Lockwood. Specific class locations will be included in the course confirmations, which will be mailed at least one week prior to the beginning of class.

Comics provide narrative experiences for students just beginning to read and for students acquiring a new language. Students follow story beginnings and endings, plot, characters, time and setting, sequencing without needing sophisticated word decoding skills. Images support the text and give students significant contextual clues to word meaning. Comics act as a scaffold to student understanding. Comic Life is the perfect software tool for all students to be creative.

TO REGISTER for INSERVICE EDUCATION COURSES

Registration is open until one week prior to the first meeting of each class and full payment is required with registration. Registrations will not be accepted after the first meeting of class. Full refunds will be given in the event of a class cancellation or if the In-Service Office is notified at least one week prior to the first meeting of class.

School **of Education students** who desire In-Service courses that will apply to their degree must register with their advisor and obtain prior permission. **Nondegree students** may register for In-Service courses by mail or in person. There is a onetime application fee of \$50 for all new students. This fee entitles students to unlimited transcripts. All registered students are also entitled to full library privileges and use of the University Fitness Center and pool during the semester for which they are registered.
