A deferred payment plan is offered to students, arrangements can be made through the Business Office.

School of Education graduate alumni may take graduate MA/MAT/MET face-to-face classes at \$300 per credit hour. Students must fill out a reduced tuition application form before the tuition can be reduced. Certain courses are not eligible for the reduced alumni rate. Webster's online Connections portal allows students to perform various self-help functions:

ONLINE COURSE INFORMATION

Note:

- All students taking an online course must be logged in by **Tuesday** of the first week of classes.
- All new online graduate students must register for their online classes no later than the **Wednesday** before the week the class begins, otherwise enroll for the following term.
- All new EdS students must register for their online classes no later than the **Friday** of the week the class begins, otherwise enroll for the following term.

AFTER YOU ENROLL IN AN ONLINE COURSE

1. Go to the Online Programs web site at <http://www.webster.edu/online>.
2. Select the **Students** tab and review the **Get Started Right Now** section for information on:
 - a. **Technical Requirements**
 - b. **Logging In**
 - c. Obtaining your **CONNECTONS ID & Password**
 - d. Going through the **WorldClassRoom Quick Start Guide** on the **Planning for Success** tab.
3. To order your **textbooks** go to <http://www.webster.edu/online> and click on the online bookstore box. Make sure you purchase within plenty of time. You will need your textbook during the first week of class.
4. **Login to your WorldClassRoom course** on the appropriate log in date/time. Students will have access to their course anytime after noon on the login date. Also, check your Student Schedule the correct login dates.
5. To access your Student Schedule, log into **CONNECTIONS**, select the **Student** tab and go to **Student Academic Services**. Enter your Connections ID and password, and then click on **Student Schedule**.
6. To access your Online Course, go to www.webster.edu/online and click on **Course Login**. Enter your ID and password.
7. Check the Online Programs web site at www.webster.edu/online for **Important Information and Announcements**.

TEACHER CERTIFICATION

Webster University School of Education offers the following initial certifications, which may be pursued at both the undergraduate and graduate level.

 - Unified Science/Biology (9-12)
- Special Education (K-12) (Mild/Moderate Cross-Categorical)

In addition to the certification areas listed above, the following advanced certifications may be pursued at the graduate level.

- English as a Second Language (ESOL) (K-12)
- Gifted Education (K-12)
- Reading Specialist (K-12)
- Severely Developmentally Disabled

As part of our Education Specialist degree (Ed.S.) the following administrative certification areas may be pursued:

- Elementary Principal (K-8)
- Middle School Principal (5-9)
- Secondary Principal (7-12)
- Special Education Director (K-12)

In order to determine what coursework, requirements and/or documentation may be required to complete teacher certification, contact the teacher certification office to schedule an appointment. Note: you will need to provide copies of transcripts in order to have a certification evaluation completed.

IN-SERVICE

In addition to offering graduate degrees and certificates to help teachers gain additional skills and expertise for the classroom, the School of Education at Webster also offers in-service courses designed to enhance knowledge in a variety of areas.

Most In-service classes meet at the Webster University campus, 470 E. Lockwood. Specific locations will be included in the course confirmations, which will be mailed at least one week prior to the beginning of class.

- In-Service courses might be considered for State of Missouri or other tuition reimbursement programs, however they are not designed for teacher licensure or certification.
- Students currently pursuing a degree at Webster University may transfer up to 6 hours of 5410 courses toward their graduate degree with approval of their advisor.
- 5210 courses may be applicable toward a graduate degree with prior approval of the advisor and the area of concentration coordinator.
