

GENERAL EDUCATION IN THE SCHOOL OF COMMUNICATION

The School of Communications established the first general education program at Webster University. It is separate and distinct from the 27 hour/9 category system the other Schools and Colleges use.

A minimum of 36 credit hours must be taken from the liberal arts and sciences with the following distribution:

Category One - Humanities - 18 hours

Literature (ENGL), history (HIST), foreign language (ESLG, FREN, GERM, ILC, ITAL, JAPN, LATN, and SPAN), general studies (GNST), religious studies (RELG), philosophy (PHIL), visual art (ART and ARHS), dance (DANC), theatre (THEA), music (MUSC), and composition (WRIT).

Category Two -Social Sciences - 12 hours

Political science (POLT), sociology (ANSO), psychology (PSYC), anthropology (ANSO), women's studies (WOMN), multicultural studies (MULC), international relations (INTL), international studies (ISTL), economics (ECON), and human rights (HRTS) as well as LEGL 2080 topics courses

Category Three - Math/Computer Science - 6 hours

Computer applications (COAP), computer science (COSC), mathematics (MATH), natural sciences (BIOL and CHEM), and physical sciences (PHYS and SCIN).

Within each category, students may choose any combination of courses with the appropriate departmental prefixes to meet the requirement, including additional courses with the same prefix.
