ADMISSION POLICIES FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS

When considering an application, Webster looks for evidence of potential for academic success. A cumulative GPA on all college level coursework of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale is preferred; however, each applicant is given individual consideration. If you have circumstances, which might affect your admission, they may be discussed confidentially with a member of the admissions staff. The University operates on rolling admission, and application files are reviewed by Admissions as soon as all requested credentials have been received.

ADMISSION PROCEDURES

If you wish to enroll as a degree-seeking student, you must first apply for admission to the University. The application process requires you to submit to the Admissions Office the following credentials:

- The completed and signed application for undergraduate transfer admission form.
- A \$35 non-refundable application processing fee.
- A 300-500 word essay on the topic of your choice.
- Evening students may submit an autobiographical essay or a professional resume.
- An official transcript mailed directly from each college, university or other post-secondary institution attended showing all work attempted to date.
(If you have completed fewer than 30 credit hours, you must also submit a copy of your high school transcript or GED scores.)
- Art, dance, film production, music and theatre students must arrange an audition/interview/portfolio review.
- B.S.N. students should contact the Director of Nursing at 968-7483 for additional credentials and requirements.
- English majors must submit a graded paper written for a college English course; Creative Writing students must submit a portfolio of creative writing pieces.

Applications may be submitted online at www.webster.edu or paper applications may be requested from and submitted to the Undergraduate Admission Office or the Graduate and Evening Student Admission Office.

All transfer coursework must be college-level (100-level or above) with a passing grade. Pass/Fail courses will count for transfer credit if the student received a Pass. Repeated courses – only the second grade will be counted. Incomplete grades are not accepted in transfer. Courses completed with a grade of “D” have severe transfer restrictions and generally are not applicable toward major or General Education Requirements. Transfer course equivalency requirements for the major are determined by the appropriate department. See departmental transfer guides for more specific information. Formal evaluation of transfer credit is conducted by the Office of the Registrar upon admission to the University. A free estimated evaluation may be requested by contacting the Admissions Office.

TRANSFER OF CREDIT WITH DEGREE

Courses included in a completed Associate in Arts (A.A.) degree, Associate in Fine Arts (A.F.A.) degree, Associate in Science (A.S.) degree, or Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree will transfer to Webster University provided they are college level (100-level or above). Webster University will accept coursework completed prior to the date the degree was awarded, up to a maximum of 98 credit hours of transfer credits.

Students with an Associate in Arts (A.A.) degree will have fulfilled all of Webster University’s General Education Requirements.

Students with an Associate in Science (A.S.) degree, Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree, or Associate in Fine Arts (A.F.A.) degree will have their transfer coursework evaluated on a course-by-course basis for equivalency with Webster University’s General Education Requirements.

TRANSFER CREDIT WITH NO DEGREE AND/OR CERTIFICATE

Coursework completed as part of a certificate program or coursework completed not leading to a degree will also transfer to Webster University provided it is college level (100-level or above) with a passing grade. A maximum of 64 credit hours may be transferred without an Associate degree.

College test scores (ACT or SAT) are not required if you have been out of high school for more than one year.

Your application and credentials should be completed at least one month prior to your desired term of enrollment. Applications submitted less than two weeks before the start of the term may not be reviewed in time for registration for that term. Please contact the Admissions Office for specific deadlines and entry dates. Early application is encouraged.

Students who desire consideration for scholarships and/or financial aid must meet the published deadlines for these respective programs. Early application is encouraged for priority consideration.

Fees

Fees may be charged, in addition to tuition, for certain courses including, but not limited to applied music lessons, media production classes, and computer courses. These fees will vary, but are published in the Course Schedule Book each semester.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Academic scholarships are offered each fall and spring semester to all qualified full-time students who have achieved a cumulative G.P.A. of at least 3.0 or higher (on a 4.0 scale), and who complete their admission application prior to April 1 for fall enrollment and December 1 for spring enrollment. Transfer scholarships generally range from \$3,500 to \$9,500 and are renewable. You may request consideration for scholarship on your admission application.

Phi Theta Kappa Scholarships

Webster University will grant scholarship consideration to Phi Theta Kappa members who seek to be new full-time, flat-fee degree-seeking undergraduate students. Applicants must have completed an Associate degree prior to enrollment at Webster and have achieved a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher on all college work. Students must enroll at Webster University in the subsequent semester following their graduation from SLCC. A separate application for this scholarship and documentation of membership is required. Scholarships range from \$4000 to \$10,000 per year, based on the grade point average, and are renewable. Deadline for maximum consideration is April 1 for fall enrollment and December 1 for spring enrollment.

A competitive full tuition scholarship is offered each year to one Phi Theta Kappa member who has demonstrated Distinguished Achievement in Phi Theta Kappa with at least a 3.7 lifetime cumulative GPA and who will complete an Associate degree prior to enrollment at Webster. Separate application and recommendation from chapter advisor is required. Deadline for application is April 1.

A+ Scholarship

Webster University will grant scholarship consideration to students who have graduated from an A+ high school program as certified by the state of Missouri. Applicants must have completed the requirements for certification to receive the A+ award and have completed an Associate's degree with at least a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 on all college work attempted. Scholarships range from \$1000 to \$2000. Separate application and documentation of A+ certification on a high school transcript is required. Deadline for application is April 1 for fall enrollment and December 1 for spring enrollment.

SPECIAL STUDY OPPORTUNITIES

Combined Degrees Programs

This program enables highly qualified students to complete both a Bachelor degree and a Master degree through an integrated and accelerated program. Through a carefully designed course of study, a student combines an undergraduate major and other coursework with one of the approved graduate programs. A set of undergraduate pre-requisite courses prepares the student for his/her chosen graduate area. Upper-level undergraduate courses are integrated with initial graduate courses in the curriculum, thereby reducing the total time for both degrees by 12 credit hours. Students who have accumulated between 64-98 credits and have maintained a cumulative GPA of 3.3 or better are eligible to apply for the program. Students must already be accepted as an undergraduate student at Webster University. The Combined Degrees Program requires a separate additional application which may be obtained by calling the Academic Advising Center at (314) 968-6972.
