Webster University offers several different emphases within the Counseling program. Information about the emphases is on the reverse.

Students completing the Community Counseling track or the School Guidance and Counseling track complete their degree requirements at the end of the Fall 2, 2009 term and, if not intending to become an LMHC, may graduate then. Students who wish to satisfy the requirements for opening a file with the state to become a licensed mental health intern or who are completing the Professional Mental Health Counseling track need to complete the courses offered in Spring 1 and Spring 2, 2010 and will graduate once all classes are completed.

Declaring an Emphasis within the Counseling Program

Webster University's Space Coast Region offers a choice of three emphases within the M.A. in Counseling program. Students complete only one emphasis, although that one emphasis may satisfy the requirements for more than one career path. All students enroll in the same courses for the first six terms. Beyond that, students select courses as described below.

Emphasis in Professional Mental Health Counseling

This emphasis requires 60 credits and includes a total of 1000 university-supervised practicum and internship hours. This is an appropriate emphasis for students who wish to become licensed mental health counselors and work in a private practice.

Students enroll in COUN 5150: Psychopathology in term seven and in COUN 5230: Psychodiagnostics in term eight. In the last two terms, students enroll in the listed classes. To satisfy the Specialization Requirements for Guidance and Counseling, Grades PK-12 (Plan Two) in addition to the requirements, the student will need to enroll in COUN 5680 as a 21st course at some point in the future.

Emphasis in School Guidance and Counseling

This emphasis requires 48 credits and includes a total of 700 university-supervised practicum and internship hours. This is an appropriate emphasis for students who wish to satisfy the Specialization Requirements for Guidance and Counseling, Grades PK-12 (Plan Two) and work in a school setting.

Students completing this emphasis enroll in COUN 5685: Program Development for School Counselors in term seven and in COUN 5680: Counseling in a School Setting in term eight. Students must also complete at least three of the nine credits of university-supervised practicum or internship in a school setting.

Emphasis in Community Counseling

This emphasis requires 48 credits and includes a total of 700 university-supervised practicum and internship hours. Students can satisfy the Specialization Requirements for Guidance and Counseling, Grades PK-12, within this emphasis. This emphasis is for students who do not intend to become licensed mental health counselors or for students who wish to meet both the Specialization Requirements and the licensure requirements in 20 courses/60 credits. Students who graduate with an emphasis in Community Counseling will have a broad background in counseling and may work in a variety of community and governmental agencies or in public or private schools.

Students who wish to satisfy the Specialization Requirements for Guidance and Counseling, Grades PK-12 (Plan Two) should enroll in COUN 5680 in term eight and complete at least three of the nine credits of university-supervised practicum or internship in a school setting. Students may enroll in either COUN 5685: Program Development or COUN 5150: Psychopathology in term seven.

Students may also use this emphasis to satisfy the licensure requirements by completing a total of 60 credits, including COUN 5150: Psychopathology in term seven and both courses in term nine and both courses in term ten. In term eight, students may enroll in either COUN 5680: Counseling in a School Setting or COUN 5230: Psychodiagnostics.

Students who want to satisfy both the Specialization Requirements and the pre-licensure requirements should select COUN 5150 in term seven and COUN 5680 in term eight, as well as both courses in term nine and both courses in term ten.
