## **MIDTOWN**

*Directions:* West on Big Bend Blvd. Take Big Bend to first stop light. Turn left onto Elm. Turn onto I-44 East. Exit Grand Ave. and turn left. Approximately 15-20 minutes from campus. Near St. Louis University.

### **Attractions**

Fox Theatre – Everything from concerts of top musical stars, to comedy shows, touring Broadway shows, dance troops and everything in between.

Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis – This Romanesque Byzantine cathedral contains the world’s most extensive collection of mosaic art.

Powell Symphony Hall – Home of the St. Louis Symphony (although you can find other live performances, such as Alison Krauss and Herbie Hancock, and the Flying Karamacob Brothers).

## **CENTRAL WEST END**

*Directions:* East on Big Bend Blvd. Turn right on Forest Park Parkway. Turn left on Euclid. Approximately 10-15 minutes from campus.

## **FOREST PARK**

*Directions:* West on Big Bend Blvd. Take Big Bend to first stop light. Turn left onto Elm. Turn onto I-44 East. Exit Hampton Ave. and turn left. Approximately 15-20 minutes from campus.

### **Attractions**

The “Central Park” of St. Louis has 60 miles of pavement to run, walk, roller blade, bike, or skateboard, in addition to 20 lakes and ponds and 30 ball fields.

The Jewel Box – A greenhouse that hosts flower shows throughout the year.

St. Louis Art Museum – The Fine Arts Palace of the 1904 World’s Fair; among the leading art museums in the country. Admission is FREE. [www.slam.org](http://www.slam.org)

St. Louis Zoo – World-class zoo with more than 6,000 animals. Admission is FREE. [www.stlzoo.org](http://www.stlzoo.org)

St. Louis Science Center (5050 Oakland) – Touching, listening, building, creating or exploring, you can spend an hour or the entire day doing lots of different things. Experience interactive exhibits, the Cyberville Gallery, the four story OMNIMAX Theatre and the Planetarium Building. Admission is FREE. Website: [www.slsc.org](http://www.slsc.org).

## **DOWNTOWN**

*Directions:* I-44 east to I-55 toward Illinois. Follow signs to downtown exits. Approximately 20-25 minutes from campus.

### **Attractions**

The Gateway Arch was built as a monument to President Thomas Jefferson and it soars 630 feet high above the Mississippi river. The monument is celebrated for its simplicity, beauty and enviable position as America’s tallest monument. There is a museum located below the Arch as well as “pods” to take people up into the Arch.

Union Station – Once the world’s largest train station, this National Historical landmark of unsurpassed beauty is now a shopping, dining (Hard Rock Café) and entertainment complex.

Laclede’s Landing – An entertainment district that will take you back to St. Louis’ river city past. Take a horse drawn carriage ride down cobblestone streets and dine at any one of the great restaurants. You can also catch a one hour narrated trip on a Gateway Riverboat Cruise. Attractions Include: Fat Tuesday, Jake’s Steaks, The Old Spaghetti Factory, Planet Hollywood, Mississippi Nights, The Big Bang Piano Bar, The Wax Museum of St. Louis.

## PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

**MetroLink** is St. Louis' light rail service connecting stations from East St. Louis to Lambert International Airport, with stops throughout downtown St. Louis and into St. Louis County. The station closest to Webster's campus is in the Delmar Loop. Free parking is available. In 2006 a station will open at Shrewsbury- just minutes from campus.

**MetroBus** is St. Louis' bus system with routes throughout St. Louis City, St. Louis County, and St. Clair County, IL. There are many stops within walking distance of Webster's campus. The Cross County Route has a stop at Gore and Lockwood, and the Shrewsbury Route has a stop and Lockwood and Bompert.

MetroLink and MetroBus rates are the same, starting at \$1.50 for a single ride. Daily, weekly, and monthly passes are available. Tickets can be purchased online, at stations, and at retail locations.
