**Freshman Residence Hall Options**

The residence hall contract is for the entire school year (from the date you move-in 2007 until May 9, 2008). Space is assigned on a first come-first serve basis unless there are certain resource needs. All residence halls are smoke free. First time freshmen can preference East Hall or Apartments; however, we will only place first time freshmen into those spaces as they are available. Please rank order all options (1 being most preferred, 4 being least preferred) and please return with \$150.00 deposit and \$25.00 processing fee.

**Returning or Transfer Student Options**

Webster Village Apartments are only initially available to second year and above students (first time freshmen are assigned to apartment space as space is available). All apartments are smoke-free. Students may be offered space in the residence halls if space is not available in the apartments. Please choose one of the following contract options. Please rank order your preferences (1 being most preferred, 2, 3, etc.) If you are new to on-campus housing, please return with \$150.00 deposit and \$25.00 processing fee.

- \_\_\_ **West Hall** houses 231 first year students. The rooms are suite-style (two double-occupancy bedrooms share a bathroom). Each floor in West Hall is equipped with a kitchenette, study lounge and a social lounge. Laundry facilities are on the first floor.
- \_\_\_ **Loretto Hall** houses 84 first and second year students in suite-style rooms (two double-occupancy bedrooms share a bathroom). Loretto is equipped with a TV lounge and laundry facilities.
- \_\_\_ **East Hall** houses 112 students in semi-suites, in either four single room or three double room arrangements. Each floor in East Hall is equipped with a kitchenette, study lounge and a social lounge. *First time freshmen may only apply for double room suites in East Hall.* Requests for East Hall are honored based on availability of space.
- \_\_\_ **Webster Village Apartments:** First time freshmen may be placed in a furnished two bedroom apartment as they become available. Requests for the WVA are honored based on availability of space. *First time freshmen in the WVA are required to maintain a meal plan.*

Meals may only be used by the meal plan holder (no guest meals). Unused meals at the end of the semester do not roll over to the next semester (you begin new week with a new set of 23 meals). However, points left over from the fall semester will roll over and add to the points for the spring semester.

\_\_\_\_\_ **Meal Plan C: 180 meals per semester and \$75 in points for the semester.**

Meals can be used anytime throughout the semester for the student holder of the meal plan or their guest(s). Unused meals at the end of the semester do not roll over to the next semester. However, any points left over from the fall semester will roll over and add to the points for the spring semester.
