The Webster Student Film Festival is a large-scale showing of student work to celebrate the close of each Spring semester. . **We accept submissions from students of all levels of production experience—from Video 1 to Senior Overview!**

The WFVS held host to the first annual Webster Student Film Festival on May 6, 2006. The festival was included as part of the Webster Film Series, and took place in the Winifred Moore Auditorium. 21 student films were showcased, and three winners were chosen via audience choice.
