Students are strongly encouraged to meet with a Webster University transfer admissions counselor early in their academic career to ensure a smooth transfer experience.

ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT OF MUSIC AT WEBSTER:

The Department of Music is committed to the education of musicians through transformative experiences that promote versatility and engage the whole person in a collaborative environment fostering lifelong habits of excellence in performance, creativity, scholarship, and teaching. We focus on personalized, student-centered learning where developing musicians work closely with their instructors and each other.

Webster University is an accredited institutional member of the National Association of Schools of Music.

The department offers state-approved curricula for the preparation of teachers of music in the elementary and secondary schools. The primary focus of the department is instruction designed to prepare students for careers in composition, jazz studies, music education, pedagogy, and performance. Students are also encouraged to avail themselves of several significant student opportunities in Europe and Asia.

The Department of Music presents more than 170 events each year, complementing the substantial musical environment of St. Louis. The season includes student and faculty recitals, as well as performances by guest artists and student ensembles. The University supports a number of performing groups including Chorale, Aurelia (treble-voice ensemble), Jazz Singers, Chamber Singers, Webster University Orchestra, Opera Studio, Jazz Collective, Jazz Combos, Percussion Ensemble, Wind Ensemble, and the New Music Ensemble. The department also provides various chamber music ensembles.

WEBSTER DEGREE REQUIREMENTS:

A minimum of **128** credit hours consisting of the following:

- Applicable University Global Citizenship Program hours
- Required credit hours for the Major
- Electives

WEBSTER ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

When considering an application, Webster looks for evidence of potential for academic success. A cumulative GPA on all college level coursework of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale is preferred; however, each applicant is given individual consideration. If you have circumstances which might affect your admission this may be discussed confidentially with a member of the admissions staff. The University operates on rolling admission, and application files are reviewed by an admissions counselor as soon as all requested credentials have been received.

AUDITION REQUIREMENTS:

All potential music students, upon applying to Webster, are required to audition for admittance to the Department of Music. Additional information, including audition dates, is available on the [Office of Admission website](#). Specific information on audition requirements for each major is available from the [Department of Music](#).

IMPORTANT TRANSFER NOTES:

- Webster has a minimum residency requirement that 30 of the student's last 36 credits must be taken at Webster University. All students must have a minimum of 128 credit hours to graduate.
- For students seeking a BM, a minimum of 30 credit hours must be taken in the Department of Music at Webster University. For students seeking a BA, a minimum of 18 credit hours (including 2 credit hours of MUSC 4000 Applied Music) must be taken in the Department of Music at Webster University.
- Students must earn a grade of C or better in any course they wish to apply toward major requirements.
- Students must earn a grade of C- or better in any course they wish to apply toward general education/GCP.
- Once a student matriculates at Webster University, no music courses required for the music major may be taken outside of Webster.
- Webster University provides full transfer of coursework successfully completed as part of an associate degree awarded by a regionally accredited institution. While students with associate degrees typically transfer 60-64 credit hours, Webster will transfer in all coursework that is part of the completed associate degree. Transfer of additional lower-division credit beyond the associate degree is restricted. All transfer credit is capped at 98 credit hours.
- All transfer coursework must be college-level (100-level or above) with a passing grade. Pass/Fail courses will count for transfer credit if the student received a Pass. For repeated courses only the second grade will be counted. Incomplete grades are not accepted in transfer. Courses completed with a grade of D have severe

transfer restrictions. Formal evaluation of transfer credit is conducted by the Office of the Registrar upon admission to the University.

MISSOURI REVERSE TRANSFER:

Webster University is participating in the [Missouri Reverse Transfer](#) statewide initiative to help more Missourians earn associate degrees. Webster has partnered with each community college in the state to help students apply Webster University credit back to the community college to earn the associate degree, if they transferred prior to earning the degree. Please speak with your transfer admissions counselor or academic advisor for more information.

GENERAL EDUCATION/GLOBAL CITIZENSHIP PROGRAM:

Webster University requires all baccalaureate students to complete a general education program. The Global Citizenship Program (GCP) is a set of undergraduate degree requirements and a general education program developed by Webster University faculty to help prepare students to confront global problems and 21st century challenges.

Students who complete an Associate of Arts (AA) degree or the CBHE-approved CORE 42 of general education before transferring to Webster University will have satisfied the general education requirements and FRSH 1200 First Year Seminar requirement of the GCP. All students are required to take the Global Keystone Seminar at Webster.

Students who have completed an Associate of Fine Arts (AFA) degree from a regionally accredited community college and pursuing a Bachelor of Fine Arts or Bachelor of Music degree at Webster will have satisfied the first year seminar and general education section of the Global Citizenship Program, as accommodated for the BFA or BM. Students with an AFA who choose to pursue a degree other than a BFA or BM at Webster will have coursework evaluated on a course-by-course-basis for the GCP.

Students completing other associate degrees (AS, AAS) will have previous credits reviewed on a course-by-course basis for applicability to the GCP and will work with their department of music advisor to determine remaining GCP course requirements for the applicable music degree.

Admission to the Department of Music is by audition. All transfer course equivalency will be subject to review at the time of audition and/or matriculation.**

Students pursuing the BA in Music- Voice, must fulfill a foreign language requirement by studying in French, German, or Italian. Students can fulfill this requirement at St. Louis Community College by successfully completing 9 credit hours in one of the languages or by passing an appropriate 2000-level language course. All courses must be in 16-week format.

Students pursuing the Bachelor of Music in Vocal Performance fulfill a foreign language requirement by studying French, German, or Italian. Students can fulfill the requirement by successfully completing with a C or better 12 credit hours of

foreign language, by passing two sequential 2000-level language courses, or by passing an intermediate level language competency examination. All courses must be in the 16-week format unless taken in Vienna.

ELECTIVES:

Elective hours can consist of any college-level courses that are not already being applied to the major or global citizenship program requirements of the degree, taken to reach the required 128 hours for graduation. Many students may choose to obtain a minor out of the required elective hours. Please keep in mind that any course applied to a minor must be taken at Webster University, with a grade of C- or better.
