JOHNSON COUNTY REGIONAL POLICE ACADEMY TRANSFER GUIDE



USING THIS GUIDE

This guide has been published for graduates of the *Johnson County Regional Police Academy* who are interested in pursuing a degree at Webster University. Credit from the completed program will transfer to the University as noted in this guide, and all transfer credit is subject to the University's regular polices on transfer credit as identified in the University catalog.

TRANSFER GUIDELINES

- Students who have completed the Johnson County Regional Police Academy must submit an official transcript from Johnson County Community College and copy of the Kansas State Certification from the Kansas Commission on Police Officers Standards and Training with academy graduation date.
- Students matriculating at Webster University may be eligible to receive 27 credit hours of transfer credit at the lower division, baccalaureate level.
 - Per university policy, this lower-division credit will be subject to the University's maximum limitation on lower-division or community college transfer credits.
- No credit will transfer which duplicates credit already earned through coursework at Webster or at any other postsecondary institution.
 - o If police academy credit has been transferred to the community college or overlaps content of credit earned at another college or university, credit award may be reduced.
- Students must also submit official transcripts for any and all coursework from other postsecondary institutions attended and meet all other admission requirements.

TRANSFER OF CREDIT

Students will receive credit for the following courses at Webster, toward the BA in Criminology:

CRIM 2000 Issues in Criminology (3 cr.)
CRIM 2250 Introduction to Crime Control Systems (3 cr.)

LEGL 3500 Criminal Litigation (3 cr.)

Basic Police Recruit Training: 15 credit hour block of General Elective credit AND

GLBC 1200 Global Cornerstone Seminar (3 cr.)

Students not interested in the Criminology degree at Webster may apply the 27 hours of credit toward general electives in another Webster degree.

FIRST RESPONDER PROGRAM

Webster University offers a First Responder Program, which offers a special tuition rate for qualified first responders, which includes law enforcement personnel, fire department personnel, EMT personnel, and 911 dispatchers.
